# Standards and Quality Report Ardvreck Nursery 2023-2024

#### Setting Aims:

Ardvreck Nursery aims to create an environment where every child can thrive, promoting a love of learning, independence, and supporting each child's development. Through integrated indoor and outdoor learning experiences guided by trained staff, we encourage hands-on exploration. Families actively participate in our educational journey through various activities and events. Our ethos of 'Earth Care, People Care, and Fair Share' underpins all activities, promoting environmental stewardship and social responsibility. Regular staff meetings and professional development sessions ensure ongoing growth and quality enhancement. Daily routines incorporate holistic development practices, nurturing values like kindness and honesty.

# Progress with Improvement Outcomes for 2023-24:

Significant progress was achieved in literacy and numeracy for both pre-school and ante pre-school children. This improvement was supported by comprehensive staff development initiatives, effective family engagement strategies, and efficient resource management practices. Additionally, there was a focus on promoting wellbeing, equality, and inclusion, evidenced by sensitivity to individual needs and observed progress, which received positive feedback and saw high participation. Looking forward, plans include enhancing understanding of rights and further refining information sharing practices. Moreover, efforts in raising attainment and achievement, such as maintaining

a positive learning environment and implementing monthly audits alongside the Maths Improvement Programme, resulted in increased staff confidence and measurable progress. Future steps aim to continue enhancing learning experiences and supporting overall wellbeing.

# Pre-School Children:

Literacy:

#### Learning: 2.3 Learning, Teaching, and Assessment

Over the past year, we have ensured consistent motivation and engagement for children through diverse and stimulating activities tailored to their interests and developmental needs.

Key strategies and initiatives include:

Personalised Learning: Adapted planning based on observation data and developmental milestone tracking to offer individualised learning experiences.

Independent Learning: Emphasis on self-directed exploration and decision-making, fostering independence and the development of the four capacities.

New Initiatives: Introduction of a planning board, Loose Parts training, Forest Kindergarten completion, and Emotion Works training, all enhancing our practices.

Maths Improvement Programme: Supporting practitioners in delivering numeracy experiences through play-based learning, evidenced by increased confidence and children's progress in numeracy.

The Jungle Journey: A 9-week program for early motor skills development, supported by Nurse Milne.

Resource Assessment: Evaluating resource use through observations and staff feedback, ensuring effectiveness.

Child Participation: Actively involving children in setting and working towards their learning goals.

Communication Channels: Employing open-door policies and annual reports to enhance collaboration and information sharing with parents.

Engagement and motivation are consistently maintained through varied activities, as demonstrated by observed participation, interest levels, and positive feedback from children and parents. Personalised learning is ensured through adapted planning, with progress tracked via developmental milestones.

Recent initiatives have had a positive impact on practice, as reflected in practitioner feedback and improvements in children's engagement and learning outcomes. The Maths Improvement Programme has notably increased practitioner confidence and children's numeracy skills, supported by data tracking and observations.

We are currently evaluating resource availability and staff training needs to improve access to digital technologies and enhance outdoor learning experiences. Evidence of positive impact includes increased engagement, progress in developmental milestones, enhanced independence, and improved learning outcomes.

Our improvement priorities focus on refining assessment strategies, enhancing practitioner skills, and strengthening communication channels with parents to ensure ongoing collaboration and support for children's learning and development. We aim to enhance access to high-quality resources and digital technologies by integrating them with our outdoor learning initiatives.

# Leadership: 1.3 Leadership of Change

Over the past year, our nursery has made significant progress through our play-based learning approach and focus on outdoor exploration, leading to notable engagement and developmental gains in children.

Key initiatives include: Weekly staff meetings Regular senior management meetings Daily briefings Monthly professional development sessions Dedicated in-service days These strategies ensure effective communication, collaboration, and continuous improvement to meet the evolving needs of our learners and community.

We track progress using developmental milestones, observations, and parent feedback, which demonstrate the success of our approach. Regular feedback from staff, parents, and children further guides our ongoing improvements.

Our commitment to values such as Earth care, people care, and fair share is highlighted through assemblies and informational booklets. Daily routines integrate these values, promoting staff reflection and maintaining our goal alignment, fostering a culture of accountability and excellence.

Engaging families and children in our core values and practices remains a priority. Activities like Peep sessions and collaborative events strengthen home-nursery connections. Comprehensive handbooks and strategic planning processes support the clarity and consistency of our continuous improvement efforts.
